Edward J. Sheehan, Jr.

President and CEO, Concurrent Technologies Corporation (CTC)



Mr. Sheehan has been at Concurrent Technologies Corporation (CTC) for 28 years and is in his 14th year as President and CEO. He leads the innovative technology successes at CTC and its subsidiary organizations and contributes to industry and community organizations through board memberships and volunteerism. In 2021, CTC and its wholly owned affiliate, Enterprise Ventures Corporation (EVC), were awarded \$78 million in contracts from government and industry partners. Mr. Sheehan guides CTC to achieve excellence in technology, including a game-changing approach to manufacturing small-caliber ammunition, ongoing efforts to improve military energy resiliency, the design and prototyping of an electric flightline generator to power fighter aircraft, and advances in friction stir welding.
